


A Look Back at... Flood of 2025 - Kerrville, TX

Health

The Structure and Function of the Human Heart

Overview

Because Heart disease is the leading cause of death in the USA, understanding the heart's structure and function, is important. We not only gain knowledge of a biological wonder but gain insight into what keeps every human life in motion. The human heart is one of the most remarkable organs in the body—both in design and duty. As the engine of the circulatory system, the heart is a fist-sized muscular pump that sustains life by ensuring that oxygen, nutrients, and hormones reach every cell, while also carrying away carbon dioxide and other waste.

Heart Structure

Located slightly left of the chest's center, the heart is protected by the sternum, and a sac called the pericardium. It consists of four chambers and several important components that maintain one-way blood flow.

Chambers:

- Right Atrium: Receives blood low in oxygen from the body.
- Right Ventricle: Sends this blood to the lungs for oxygenation.
- · Left Atrium: Receives oxygen-rich blood from the lungs.
- Left Ventricle: Pumps this oxygenated blood out to the entire body.

Valves:

Tricuspid Valve: Separates right atrium and right ventricle.

Pulmonary Valve: Connects right ventricle to the pulmonary artery.

Mitral Valve: Lies between the left atrium and left ventricle.

Aortic Valve: Opens from the left ventricle into the aorta.

Wall Lavers:

Epicardium: The protective outer layer.

Myocardium: The muscular middle layer.

Endocardium: The smooth inner lining.

Coronary Circulation: The heart muscle itself receives blood from the

coronary arteries, which branch from the aorta.

Function of the Heart

The heart's main role is to pump blood through two circulatory loops.

- Pulmonary Circulation: The right side of the heart sends blood to the lungs, where it releases carbon dioxide and takes up oxygen.
- Systemic Circulation: The left side pumps oxygenated blood to the rest of the body, delivering nutrients and oxygen to tissues.

Electrical Conduction

The heartbeat is controlled by electrical signals:

- Sinoatrial (SA) Node: Acts as the natural pacemaker.
- Atrioventricular (AV) Node: Relays signals to the ventricles.
- Bundle of His & Purkinje Fibers: Ensure coordinated contraction.

Conclusion

Its design and function demonstrate both complexity and reliability, supporting every aspect of human life. The heart beats roughly 100,000 times a day, pumping over 2,000 gallons of blood daily. Its reliability is astonishing—but equally impressive is its intricate design.
